



Agnès Bénassy-Quéré is the Director of the CEPII, the French leading research institute in international economics, and a Professor at University Paris X – Nanterre (on leave). After defending her PhD in economics at University Paris IX – Dauphine, she was appointed at the French Ministry of economy and finance (1991-1992). Then she became a lecturer at the University of Cergy-Pontoise (1992-1996), a professor at the University of Lille 2 (1997-1998), a deputy-director at CEPII (1998-2000) and a professor at the University of Paris X-Nanterre (2001-2004). In 2004, she returned to the CEPII as a deputy-director, before being appointed director in July 2006.

Agnès Bénassy-Quéré is a member of France's *Commission Economique de la Nation*, of the “Shadow ECB Council” and the *Cercle des Economistes*. She also teaches at Ecole Polytechnique. Her research interests focus on the international monetary system and European macroeconomic policy.
