### Zsolt Darvas

Zsolt Darvas, a Hungarian citizen, is Research Fellow at Bruegel (Brussels European and Global Economic Laboratory) since 2009. He is also Research Fellow at the Institute of Economics of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences and Associate Professor at the Corvinus University of Budapest. From 2005 to 2008, he was the Research Advisor of the Argenta Financial Research Group in Budapest. Before that, he worked at the research unit of the Central Bank of Hungary (1994-2005) where he served as Deputy Head during 2001-2005. He had visiting researcher positions at the Bank of Finland, Deutsche Bundesbank, De Nederlandsche Bank, Stockholm School of Economics and Bruegel. He serves as the Deputy President of the Economics Committee of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences since 2008, while he was the secretary of the committee between 2002 and 2008. Zsolt Darvas holds a Ph.D. in Economics from Corvinus University of Budapest, where, among other institutions, he teaches courses in Econometrics since 1994. His research interests include macroeconomics, international economics, central banking and time series analysis. Zsolt Darvas has many publications in international and Hungarian journals and his work continues to be very influential. His research papers gathered more than 200 citations in academic journals and research publications. He gave presentations at a large number of conferences and seminars worldwide, such as the annual conferences of the American Economic Association, European Economic Association, Royal Economic Society and Econometric Society.
