

Christoph B. Rosenberg is an advisor at the International Monetary Fund, covering Central and Eastern Europe, specifically the Baltic countries. He led the negotiations of the IMF-supported program with Latvia and has been involved in a number of other recent crisis cases in the region. From February 2005 until March 2009 Mr. Rosenberg headed the IMF's regional office for Central and Eastern Europe located in Warsaw, Poland. Earlier assignments at the IMF included positions in the Policy Development and Review Department and on the country desks for a number of transition economies in Europe, Africa and Central Asia. In 1998-2001 he was the IMF's resident representative in Uzbekistan. He has written extensively about emerging market vulnerability issues. Mr. Rosenberg holds a Ph.D. from Regensburg University (Germany) and a M.A. from Vanderbilt University (USA). He speaks English, German, French, Russian and Polish.
