

## Curriculum Vitae Hubert Gabrisch

Hubert Gabrisch was born in November 1950 in Hannover, FRG, and lives currently in Halle (Saale, Germany). He finished his studies in Tübingen and Marburg (Germany) with a diploma in economics in 1977. Later he spent a year in Warsaw (Poland), and started his professional career at the HWWA-Institute for Economic Research, Hamburg (Germany) in 1979. In 1984, He changed to the Vienna Institute for Comparative Economic Studies (WIIW) for ten consecutive years, the last two years as deputy director. He was awarded his doctorate in Economics at the Hamburg University in 1986. In 1993, he left the WIIW for the newly established Halle Institute for Economic Research in Halle (Saale), East Germany. He served as a head of department of research on central and Eastern Europe and from 2005 until 2011 as the research director of this institute. He left the IWH in February 2015, and is now an independent researcher and publisher, affiliated to the Wiesbaden Institute of Law and Economics (WILE). Between 1992 and 2014, he served several times as a member of the Executive Committee of EACES (European Association for Comparative Economic Studies), among them as its secretary. Also, he is a member of various international societies, and acts as a reviewer for many academic journals. He is author of more than hundred publications, among them refereed journals and books. Many of these publications deal with problems of the planned economy, system transition, and transition and integration into the European Union. Since 2008, his public policy research focus is on Western Balkan countries and on EU and monetary union reforms.
