



André Sapir is University Professor at the Université Libre de Bruxelles (ULB), Senior Fellow of Bruegel, the Brussels-based think tank and Research Fellow of the Centre for Economic Policy Research (CEPR). He currently serves as Chair of the High Level Expert Group appointed by the Belgian Finance Minister to make recommendations on The Future of the Belgian Financial Sector.

Previously, he worked for the European Commission, first (1990-2001) as Economic Advisor to the Director-General for Economic and Financial Affairs, and then (2001-2004) as Economic Advisor to President Romano Prodi and Executive Director of his Economic Advisory Group. From 2005 to 2009 he was External Member of President José Manuel Barroso's Economic Advisory Group. From 2011 to 2015 he was successively Vice-Chair and Chair of the Advisory Scientific Committee and Member of the General Board of the European Systemic Risk Board (ESRB), Europe's financial stability oversight body.

André Sapir has written extensively on various aspects of Europe's Economic and Monetary Union and Single Market as well as on international policy coordination, international trade and globalisation.

He holds a PhD in Economics from The Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore. He is Member of the Academia Europaea and of the Royal Academy of Belgium for Science and the Arts.
