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
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
CRD IV - Capital Requirements Regulation (CRR) - 575/2013

• Article 114

Exposures to central governments and central banks shall be assigned a 100 % risk weight, unless the treatments set out in paragraphs 2 to 7 apply (i.e. exposures to central governments and central banks for which a credit assessment by a nominated ECAI is available could be lower).

What is affected in the non-EU Western Balkans







